CONVENTION NEWS

Responding to Presiding Bishop Michael Curry's call to "Follow the Way of Jesus," deputies and bishops at the 79th General Convention of the Episcopal Church, meeting July 5-13 in Austin, Texas, acted on a record number of resolutions on key issues such as immigration, prayer book revision, the Israel-Palestine situation, and readmitting the Episcopal Church of Cuba as a diocese. Convention also passed a \$134 million budget that reflects for a further three years the presiding bishop's priorities of evangelism, racial reconciliation and creation care.
