### **Prelude**

### Process in silence

**Presider:** "Sisters and brothers in Christ, I invite you to an observance of a holy Lent..."

## **Psalm 51** (let us sing together using modified Anglican Chant) (BCP p. 266 to 267)

- 1 Have mercy on me, O God, according to your loving-kindness; \* in your great compassion blot out my offenses.
- Wash me through and through from my <u>wickedness</u>\* and cleanse me from my <u>sin</u>.
- 3 For I know my transgressions, \* and my sin is ever before me.
- 4 Against you only have I <u>sinned</u> \* and done what is evil in your <u>sight</u>.
- 5 And so you are justified when you <u>speak</u>\* and upright in your <u>judgment</u>
- 6 Indeed, I have been wicked from my <u>birth</u>,\* a sinner from my mother's <u>womb</u>.
- 7 For behold, you look for truth deep with<u>in me,</u> \* and will make me understand wisdom <u>secretly.</u>
- 8 Purge me from my sin, and I shall be <u>pure</u>; \* wash me, and I shall be clean in<u>deed</u>.
- 9 Make me hear of joy and <u>gladness</u>, \* that the body you have broken may rejoice.
- Hide your face from my sins \*
   and blot out all my iniquities.
   Create in me a clean heart. O God. \*
- 11 Create in me a clean heart, 0 <u>God</u>, \* and renew a right spirit with<u>in me</u>.
- 12 Cast me not away from your <u>presence</u>\* and take not your Holy Spirit <u>from me</u>.
- Give me the joy of your saving help again \* and sustain me with your bountiful Spirit.
- 14 I shall teach your ways to the <u>wicked</u>, \* and sinners shall return to <u>you</u>.
- Deliver me from death, 0 <u>God</u>, \* and my tongue shall sing of your righteousness, 0 God of my sal<u>vation</u>.
- 16 Open my lips, O<u>Lord,</u>\*
  - and my mouth shall proclaim your praise.
- 17 Had you desired it, I would have offered <u>sacrifice</u>; \* but you take no delight in burnt-<u>offerings</u>.
- The sacrifice of God is a troubled <u>spirit</u>; \* a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not de<u>spise</u>.

## **Litany of Penitence** (BCP p. 267 to top 269)

The Celebrant and People pray together, all kneeling as you are able

Most holy and merciful Father: We confess to you and to one another, and to the whole communion of saints in heaven and on earth, that we have sinned by our own fault in thought, word, and deed; by what we have done, and by what we have left undone.

*The Celebrant continues* 

We have not loved you with our whole heart, and mind, and strength. We have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We have not forgiven others, as we have been forgiven. *Have mercy on us, Lord.* 

We have been deaf to your call to serve, as Christ served us. We have not been true to the mind of Christ. We have grieved your Holy Spirit.

Have mercy on us, Lord.

We confess to you, Lord, all our past unfaithfulness: the pride, hypocrisy, and impatience of our lives,

We confess to you, Lord.

Our self-indulgent appetites and ways, and our exploitation of other people, *We confess to you, Lord.* 

Our anger at our own frustration, and our envy of those more fortunate than ourselves, *We confess to you, Lord.* 

Our intemperate love of worldly goods and comforts, and our dishonesty in daily life and work,

We confess to you, Lord.

Our negligence in prayer and worship, and our failure to commend the faith that is in us, *We confess to you, Lord.* 

Accept our repentance, Lord, for the wrongs we have done: for our blindness to human need and suffering, and our indifference to injustice and cruelty,

Accept our repentance, Lord.

For all false judgments, for uncharitable thoughts toward our neighbors, and for our prejudice and contempt toward those who differ from us,

Accept our repentance, Lord.

For our waste and pollution of your creation, and our lack of concern for those who come after us,

Accept our repentance, Lord.

Restore us, good Lord, and let your anger depart from us;

Favorably hear us, for your mercy is great.

Accomplish in us the work of your salvation,

That we may show forth your glory in the world.

By the cross and passion of your Son our Lord, *Bring us with all your saints to the joy of his resurrection.* 

The Priest, stands and, facing the people, says

Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who desires not the death of sinners, but rather that they may turn from their wickedness and live, has given power and commandment to his ministers to declare and pronounce to his people, being penitent, the absolution and remission of their sins. He pardons and absolves all those who truly repent, and with sincere hearts believe his holy Gospel.

Therefore we beseech him to grant us true repentance and his Holy Spirit, that those things may please him which we do on this day, and that the rest of our life hereafter may be pure and holy, so that at the last we may come to his eternal joy; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.* 

## **Absolution** (BCP p. 360)

Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. *Amen.*

## The Collect for today:

Almighty God, whose blessed Son was led by the Spirit to be tempted by Satan: Come quickly to help us who are assaulted by many temptations; and, as you know the weaknesses of each of us, let each one find you mighty to save; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen.* 

## **Liturgy of the Scriptures**

## First Lesson from the Hebrew Scriptures: Deuteronomy 26:1-11

When you have come into the land that the Lord your God is giving you as an inheritance to possess, and you possess it, and settle in it, you shall take some of the first of all the fruit of the ground, which you harvest from the land that the Lord your God is giving you, and you shall put it in a basket and go to the place that the Lord your God will choose as a dwelling for his name. You shall go to the priest who is in office at that time, and say to him, "Today I declare to the Lord your God that I have come into the land that the Lord swore to our ancestors to give us." When the priest takes the basket from your hand and sets it down before the altar of the Lord your God, you shall make this response before the Lord your God: "A wandering Aramean was my ancestor; he went down into Egypt and lived there as an alien, few in number, and there he became a great nation, mighty and populous. When the Egyptians treated us harshly and afflicted us, by imposing hard labor on us, we cried to the Lord, the God of our ancestors; the Lord heard our voice and saw our affliction, our toil, and our oppression. The Lord brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, with a terrifying display of power, and with signs and wonders; and he brought us into this place and gave us this land, a land flowing with milk and honey. So now I bring the first of the fruit of the ground that you, O Lord, have given me." You shall set

it down before the Lord your God and bow down before the Lord your God. Then you, together with the Levites and the aliens who reside among you, shall celebrate with all the bounty that the Lord your God has given to you and to your house.

Who dost bid thy faithful people cleanse their hearts and prepare with joy for the Paschal feast; that fervent in prayer and in works of mercy, and renewed by thy Word and Sacraments they may come to the fullness of grace which thou hast prepared for those who love thee.

Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

Presider and People (sing tune S. 129 in the front of the Blue Hymnal)

Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

The people stand or kneel as able, as the Celebrant continues

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the

prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

At the following words concerning the bread, the Celebrant lays a hand upon it; On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, according to his command, O Father,

Celebrant and People say together:

We remember his death, We proclaim his resurrection, We await his coming in glory;

### The Celebrant continues

And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ and his Blood of the new Covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with the Blessed Mary and Martin and all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *AMEN*.

And now as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say:
