## The Liturgy of the Word

**First Lesson is a reading from The Psalms of David** Psalm 90:1-8, (9-11), 12 **Domine, refugium** <sup>1</sup> Lord, you have been our refuge from one generation to another.

<sup>2</sup>Before the mountains were brought forth, or the land and the earth were born,

from age to age you are God.

<sup>3</sup> You turn us back to the dust and say, "Go back, O child of earth."

<sup>4</sup> For a thousand years in your sight are like yesterday when it is past and like a watch in the night.

<sup>5</sup> You sweep us away like a dream; we fade away suddenly like the grass.

<sup>6</sup> In the morning it is green and flourishes; in the evening it is dried up and withered.

<sup>7</sup> For we consume away in your displeasure; we are afraid because of your wrathful indignation.

<sup>8</sup> Our iniquities you have set before you, and our secret sins in the light of your countenance.

<sup>9</sup> When you are angry, all our days are gone; we bring our years to an end like a sigh.

<sup>10</sup> The span of our life is seventy years, perhaps in strength even eighty;

yet the sum of them is but labor and sorrow, for they pass away quickly and we are gone.

<sup>11</sup> Who regards the power of your wrath? Who rightly fears your indignation?

<sup>12</sup> So teach us to number our days that we may apply our hearts to wisdom.

## The Second Lesson is a reading from the first letter of Paul to the people of Thessalonica 5:1-11

Now concerning the times and the seasons, brothers and sisters, you do not need to have anything written to you. For you yourselves know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. When they say, "There is peace and security," then sudden destruction will come upon them, as labor pains come upon a pregnant woman, and there will be no escape! But you, beloved, are not in darkness, for that day to surprise you like a thief; for you are all children of light and children of the day; we are not of the night or of darkness. So then let us not fall asleep as others do, but let us keep awake and be sober; for those who sleep at night, and those who are drunk, get drunk at night.

But since we belong to the day, let us be sober, and put on the breastplate of faith and love, and for a helmet the hope of salvation. For God has destined us not for wrath but for obtaining salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, who died for us, so that whether we are awake or asleep we may live with him. Therefore encourage one another and build up each other, as indeed you are doing.

As for this worthless slave, throw him into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.'''
